ALL-STAR INTEREST DECLARATION

Hazel Dell Little League will soon be selecting the All-Star teams that will participate in summer tournaments and hopefully go on to represent our league in the State Championships, and possibly beyond.

To be eligible, your family must commit to daily practices or games, from the day the All Stars are announced to the end of July. Any days the player is not available must be disclosed up front, on this form. This means that if you have any family vacations, other events or commitments planned before the end of July. These prior commitments <u>could deem</u> them ineligible, as they may take away an opportunity for another player who has none or fewer. Please know that parents must shoulder the expense associated with traveling to the All-Star tournaments. Families are also expected to help the team and to also assist with league-hosted tournaments.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

Players and parents must sign and follow a code of conduct agreement.

Our league bylaws prohibit participation with another team for the duration of the All-Star practice and game tournament season.

Participate in at least 8 of the regular season's games.

Submit a valid original or certified copy (no photocopies) of state-issued Birth Certificate (required every year).

Provide three different proofs of residency within the league boundaries or a **valid School Enrollment Verification form**, **signed by a school official (This is the preferred verification)**. For questions about residency proofs, please contact our league Player Agent, at playeragent@hdll.org.

All-Stars is about representing your league and winning as many games as possible to move on to the next level in the tournament process. To be All-Stars means to be the best athletes, role models, students and members of the Hazel Dell community. Parents in the stands also represent the Hazel Dell community and are expected to act appropriately and follow all the local rules and regulations of the host facility.

Sportsmanship is required from all family members while watching the players give their best on the field. Family members must remember that the coaches are committed to excellence. The coaches will do their best to win and go as far as possible in the tournaments. They expect and need family members to trust in their decisions to try and achieve greatness. Family members must withhold negative comments and never attempt to approach the team during a game or coach from the stands. Questions should come directly to the whole coaching staff and only at appropriate times.

Encourage our athletes, remain positive, focus on what is going well, work hard, give your best, and above all have fun. Good luck!

LITTLE LEAGUE® INTERNATIONAL PLAYER RESIDENCY AND SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

For a child to be a Little Leaguer®, eligibility must first be established by way of residency inside the boundaries of a local Little League®, or the location of the school where the child attends is located inside a local league's boundaries that is approved by Little League Baseball, Incorporated.

Residency and School Attendance Eligibility Requirements:

- A school issued report card or performance record will no longer be accepted to establish school attendance. Either the <u>school enrollment form</u> or an **official/certified school enrollment record** can be used to establish school attendance.
- Also, <u>residence</u> shall be established and supported by documents containing the full residence which includes parent(s) or guardian(s) name, street address, city, state and zip code information, dated or in force between February 1 of the previous year and February 1 of the current year, from one or more documents from **EACH** of the three Groups outlined below:

Group I

- 1. Driver's License (photo ID of parent(s) or guardian(s) with qualifying residence address)
- 2. School records (home address of player's parents or guardians)
- 3. Vehicle records (i.e., registration, lease, etc.)
- 4. Employment records
- 5. Insurance documents (with residence address)

Group II

- 1. Welfare/childcare records
- 2. Federal records (i.e., Federal Tax, Social Security, etc.)
- 3. State records
- 4. Local (municipal) records
- 5. Support payment records
- Homeowner or tenant records
- 7. Military records

Group III

- 1. Voter's Registration
- 2. Utility bills (i.e., gas, electric, water/sewer, phone, mobile phone, heating, waste disposal)
- 3. Financial records (loan, credit, investments, etc.)
- 4. Medical records
- 5. Internet, cable, or satellite television records

NOTE: Example – Three documents from the same Group (utility bill, cable bill, and bank statement) constitute only ONE document.

Be aware that players who established "residence" or "school attendance" for regular season and/or tournament eligibility prior to the 2018-2019 season by using the <u>Tournament Player Verification form</u>, and who can produce the form with proper proofs and signatures from the first year that the Tournament Player Verification form was used for that player, will be grandfathered and will NOT need to complete a new Tournament Player Verification Form.

In preparation for the Little League International Tournament, local leagues are to be aware that tournament Eligibility Affidavit will this year require all tournament teams to complete and carry a <u>Tournament Player Verification form</u> for every rostered player.
